## 2. Meetings

After the COVID-19 pandemic, the Globility Commission concentrated its effort on the organization of sessions within the Centennial Congress of the International Geographical Union. Despite the uncertainties in the evolution of the pandemic, the French National Committee of Geography (CNFG) together with the La Sorbonne Local Organizing Committee considered the historic celebration of the IGU Centennial Congress, under the slogan “the time of geographers”, as an opportunity for the entire community to come together returning to "face-to-face" gatherings. Consequently, the Globility Commission decided to support this type of meeting proposing six own sessions and one joint session. The table below reports summary information on date, sessions, and number of participants.

The Globility Commission organized six own sessions and one joint session in the **IGU-UGI Paris The Centennial Congress (2022)**.

The face-to-face own sessions:

- a) Immigrant entrepreneurship, international mobilities and sustainable local development in rural areas (five papers from ten contributors).
- b) A transnational perspective of human mobility through the left-behind areas (seven papers from nine contributors)
- c) From lifestyle migrations to digital nomadism (six papers from eight contributors)
- d) Mobility/Immobility during the pandemic and post-pandemic times: local perspectives (ten papers from ten contributors)
- e) Students' mobility and labour mobility: a life course approach (ten papers from eleven contributors)
- f) Digital tools: new practices for moving and new sources for studying mobility (ten papers from 24 contributors)

A joint session with the Gender and Geography Commission and the Population Geography Commission:

- g) Cross-Frontier Flows in Maritime and Land Border Areas (four papers from five contributors)

With respect to the papers presented in these Globility sessions of the Paris meeting, a selection of the contributions was made for the special issue “Current trends in the global mobility: theory, method and practice” of the Hungarian Geographical Bulletin (HGB). HGB is an international, cross-disciplinary, scholarly, peer-reviewed, and open access journal in the field of geography, ranked in

SCOPUS (Q2). The guest editors of this special issue are Barbara Staniscia, Josefina Domínguez-Mujica and Gábor Michalkó and the publication is estimated for the 2023 second semester.

Furthermore, in the framework of the Paris meeting, the Chair of the Commission, Josefina Domínguez-Mujica, was invited by the Organizing Committee to take part in a plenary round table under the issue “A planet of migrants” that took place on July 20 in the Centre Sorbonne Pantheon Amphithéâtre 3 and was broadcasted in streaming to virtual attendants.

### 3. Planned meetings of the Commission to be held in 2023 and topics to be addressed

The Globility Commission will propose some sessions for the **9th EUGEO Conference in Barcelona, from 4-7 September 2023**, under the slogan “Geography for our common future”. The members of the Globility Steering Committee have been invited to propose some sessions and this call is open, given that the deadline session’s proposal is January 9.

### 4. Networking, communication, and dissemination

**4.a. Networking.** As it has already been mentioned, Globility has kept contacts with other IGU Commissions to promote joint sessions in the IGU congresses or regional conferences, as happened with the last IGU Congress with the Commission on ‘Population Geography’ and ‘Gender Geography’.

**4.b. Communication and dissemination.** The most important obstacle for the Globility Commission has been to promote the organization of meetings out of the context of IGU events, especially after the pandemic, given the cancellation or postponement of numerous scientific events. Therefore, dissemination activities have been implemented through different channels, above all publications. Thereby, in compliance with the agreement that Armando Montanari and Josefina Domínguez-Mujica have made with the editor of BELGEO (Christian Vandermotten), a special issue (2022-3) was published on the topic “Reflections on human mobility in pandemic and post-pandemic times”-

**4.c.** Another ongoing initiative is the contribution from members of the Globility’s Steering Committee to the book proposed by Jerzy Bański on “Research directions, challenges and achievements of modern geography” under the Springer series on Advances in Geographical and Environmental Sciences. The chapter’s title will be: Global Change and Human Mobility in the Anthropocene.

## 6. Statement of the mission of the Commission and proposed actions to be undertaken until 2024

**6.1. Committee:** Complying with the IGU statute’s rules, the Steering Committee was renewed in 2020 (four members were replaced, and two former members were appointed as honorary members).

### 6.2. Objectives:

Founding objective of the Commission:

To examine and interpret those forms of human mobility that may be related to the processes of global change, to new forms of investment, local development, and social and cultural behaviour, all of them within the framework of the following processes:

- The internationalisation of economic activities leads to new forms of short-term labour mobility, and a distinctive feature of such forms of mobility in the way they combine economic, social, and cultural functions and the globalisation of information and knowledge.
- New forms of leisure, recreation, free time, and tourism have provided the bases and strategies for the development and restructuring of urban and rural regions.

- Changes in the knowledge, use and valuation of global resources, and the restructuring of industrial activity transforming the patterns of labour mobility.
- Changes in the organisation and flexibility of labour activities, and in the institutional structure of pensions favour the process of internationalisation of consumption, including retailing and retirement.
- Perspectives on increasing forced (refugee) migrations due to the persistence of inequalities.

New objective of the Commission, following the founding one previously stated:

To elaborate new thoughts and ideas regarding the advance of new forms of mobility after the pandemic. The context of the advance of the Global Digital Capitalism, of the increasing imbalances between regions' income and standard of living because of the persistent armed conflicts and the consequences of the climate change, will guide some of the most important reflections on the role of human mobility in a world of continuous global change.

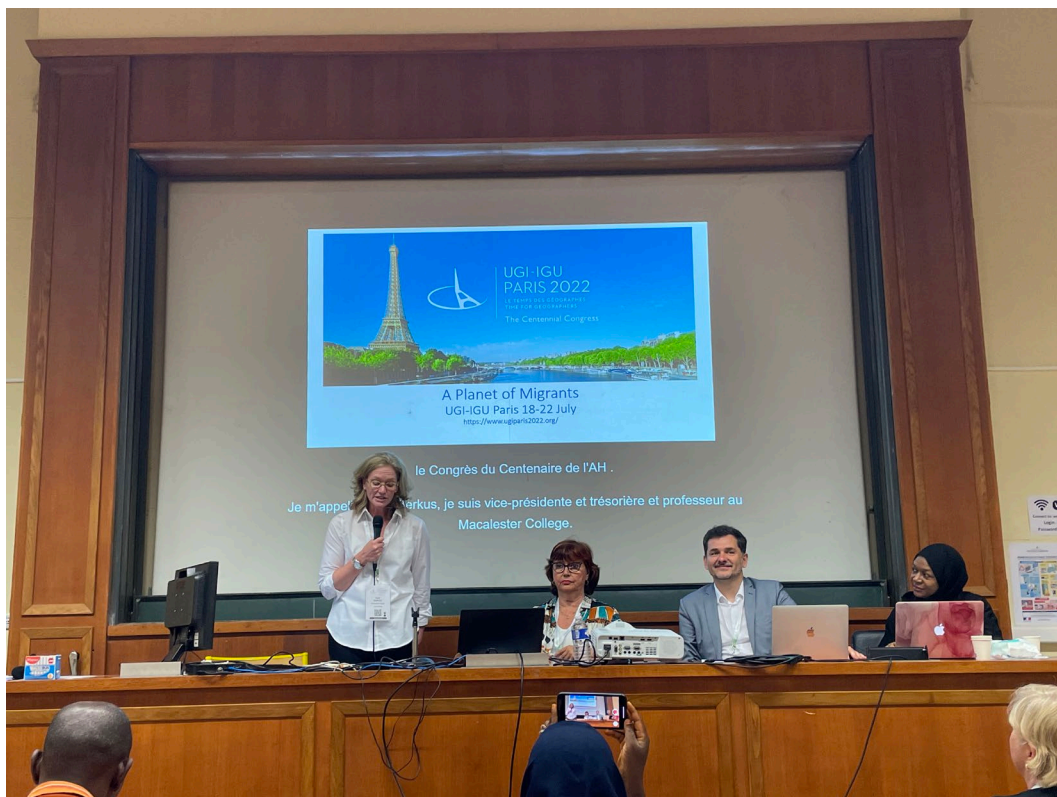
