2. International Conferences

The Globility Commission has participated in two international conferences in 2025.

a) The **IGU Egypt 2025 Thematic Conference on Geo-Spatial Technology, Global Changes and Sustainability** took place in Cairo, Egypt (12–14 April) under the slogan “Geography for our common future.” The event was organized by the IGU Urban Geography Commission and the Local and Regional Development Commission, aiming to identify scientific and practical responses to a broad set of global challenges through a holistic approach. Several members of the Globility Commission attended and contributed to the conference.

b) The **10th EUGEO Congress 2025 (“Geographies of a Changing Europe”)** was held in Vienna from 8–11 September 2025, hosted at the Austrian Academy of Sciences (ÖAW) and organised by the Institute for Urban and Regional Research (ISR) together with the Austrian Geographical Society (ÖGG). In total, the congress brought together around 550 participants and ran 84 sessions, featuring more than 130 scholarly presentations spanning human and physical geography, spatial research/regional development, cartography & geoinformation, and geography education/didactics. Beyond the parallel sessions, the programme included keynotes, as well as city walks and social/networking events, which helped connect research discussions to Vienna’s urban context.

6. Mission Statement of the Commission and Planned Actions for 2026

6.1. Committee:

The Globility Steering Committee is set to be renewed in 2026.

6.2. Objectives:

Founding objectives of the Commission:

To examine and interpret those forms of human mobility that may be related to the processes of global change, to new forms of investment, local development, and social and cultural behaviour, all of them within the framework of the following processes:

- The internationalization of economic activities has given rise to new forms of short-term labour mobility; distinctive ways of mobility in the way they combine economic, social, and cultural functions and the globalisation of information and knowledge.
- Emerging trends in leisure, recreation, free time, and tourism have become pivotal in shaping strategies for the development and transformation of urban and rural regions.
- Shifts in the knowledge, utilisation, and valuation of global resources, along with the restructuring of industrial activities, are redefining patterns of labour mobility.
- Changes in the organization and flexibility of labour practices, as well as adjustments in institutional pension structures, are driving the internationalization of consumption, including retail and retirement
- Increasing forced migrations (refugees) are anticipated due to the persistent inequalities across regions.

A new objective of the Commission, following the founding one, has been added after the COVID health crisis:

To develop new perspectives and ideas on the evolution of emerging forms of mobility in the post-pandemic era, key reflections will be shaped by the context of advancing global digital capitalism, growing disparities in regional income and living standards due to persistent armed conflicts, and the far-reaching impacts of climate change. These factors will serve as a framework for exploring the role of human mobility in a world undergoing constant global transformation.
